The Scouting year has not long begun yet Cubs from across the Region have been very busy indeed!

Cub Scout Leadership Course

On Saturday 2 March, we held a very successful Cub Scout Leadership Course at Bundilla Scout Camp. This course is proving very popular. We had registrations from 78 Cubs, however we have found that we can only cater for 60 Cubs on any one course and capped the numbers.

Due to the popularity of the course, we have increased the number of courses on offer this year to three, with the next course scheduled for 10th August Also, due to the change in the Age Ranges, **Cubs that attend must be aged between 10 and 11 years of age**.

It was alarming the number of Cubs that had not completed the required pre-course work. Two pre-course worksheets are sent out to the Cub Scout Leaders for distribution to participants. Can I please ask that all Leaders follow up with their Cubs that they have completed the worksheets and that they bring the worksheets with them to the course. Unfortunately, the Cubs cannot be awarded the Cub Scout Leadership Badge until they have completed all requirements.

With so many Cubs attending, we need at least **14** Leaders to assist in delivering the course. My sincere thanks to my all the leaders that helped out on the day. We couldn't have done it without you - I hope you enjoyed the day.

Catering for all the hungry Cubs and Leaders was well under control as usual, by the Pinnaroo Fellowship Team under the guidance of Tricia Shaw. Thank you for giving up your Saturday to ensure we were all fed!

The Cubs participated enthusiastically in all the sessions and activities, and gave us some very good feedback in our Forum session and 'review' of the day.

The Joey/Cub Fun day on the water was held at Lake Parramatta on Saturday 9th March. 


